Tampa Jewish Family Services Touched 10,000 Lives Last Year

1,500 counseling sessions provided to individuals, families and seniors. 4,000 bags of food given to hungry families, seniors, the disabled and unemployed. Over 1,008 community referrals for those who call for help. 268 families received financial assistance. **150 emergency** financial assistance checks issued to pay for utilities, rent and car payments. \$12,000 in interest-free **loans** made to bridge financial gaps. All of this for the 69% of our clients who earn less than \$25,000 per year. 16% of former TJFS donors are now recipients of our services.
